## Georgia Youth Summit Planning Committee Applications due **JANUARY 15, 2010**

### What is the Georgia Youth Summit?

The Georgia Youth Summit is a statewide event designed to create an awareness of state/local issues, to enhance youth-adult partnerships on the local level, and to equip youth to become active locally in the betterment of their communities by identifying problems and developing solutions for issues related to economic development, education, health and safety. The Department of Community Affairs (DCA) provides funding for the Summit as a project of the Georgia Rural Development Council's Youth Leadership Initiative.

### What is the Role of the Planning Committee?

The planning committee is composed of a diverse group of youth and adults from around Georgia. They will help with planning, coordinating and evaluating the Summit.

They will develop a theme for the event, develop curriculum for workshops, organize and preside over assemblies and develop follow up activities to maximize the impact of the event.

### What is Required of Planning Committee Members?

Planning committee members should be in 10<sup>th</sup> grade or higher and will be expected to attend the following meetings at the Rock Eagle 4-H Center in Eatonton, GA:

- Planning meeting 1: Evening of **February 27<sup>th</sup>**– to afternoon of **February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2010**.
- Planning meeting 2: Evening of **June 26<sup>th</sup>** to afternoon of **June 27<sup>th</sup>, 2010**.  
(Other than Current State 4-H Officers, there should be no conflicts with State 4-H Council Activities.)
- Planning meeting 3 Evening of **August 7<sup>th</sup>** – to afternoon of **August 8<sup>th</sup>, 2010**.
- The 2010 Georgia Youth Summit – The evening of **September 10<sup>th</sup> through the afternoon of September 13<sup>th</sup>, 2010**.
- Participate in periodic conference calls and contribute to group assignments throughout the planning process. Summit coordinators will take into consideration the busy schedules of youth participants and will be sure not to over load Planning Committee Members.

Participants must provide their own transportation to and from events, but they will be reimbursed for mileage.

All meals and lodging will be covered at all planning meetings and the Youth Summit itself. Lodging and meals can be provided for adult chaperones if needed.

Adult Chaperones must complete the UGA Volunteer Screening Process. There is no cost to the volunteer.

Applications are due no later than **Friday, January 15th, 2010**.
